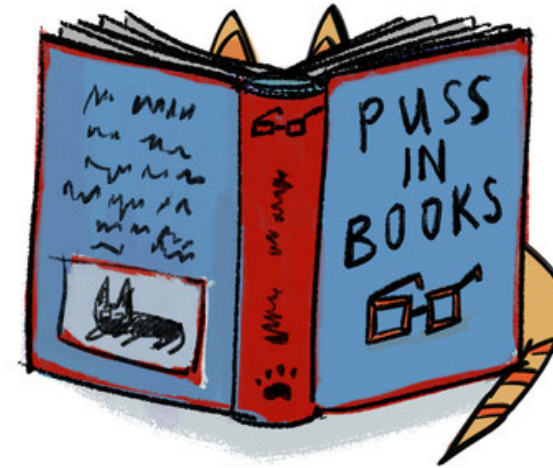

Kids Capers Guest Interview - Jules Faber



Jules Faber has been a cartoonist, caricature artist, animator and editorial cartoonist. In his most current iteration he is a popular children's book illustrator, having illustrated 28 books since 2014 which together have sold well over 1 million copies. Some of these titles include David Warner's Kaboom Kid series and the Stinky Street Stories series. He has won several Rotary Cartoon Awards, numerous KOALAs (Kids Own Australian Literature Awards), a YABBA (Young Australian Best Book Awards), Book of the Year from the Australian Book Industry Awards, the Prix de la Presse Internationale (International Press Prize) at the St Just le Martel International Cartoon Festival and, most recently, the best Children's Book Illustrator at the 2017 Stanley Awards for the Australian Cartoonists Association.



In his private life he enjoys movies, comics and pop culture. He is currently serving his fourth term as ACA President and figures he could get more done if he just got up earlier.

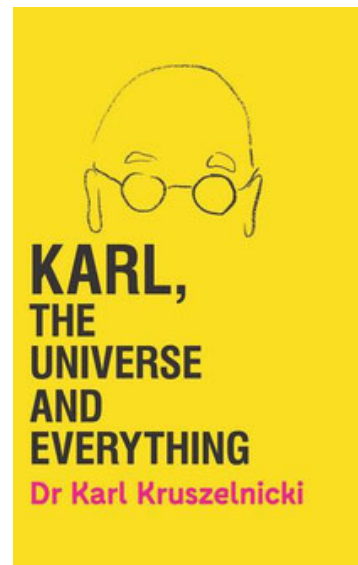
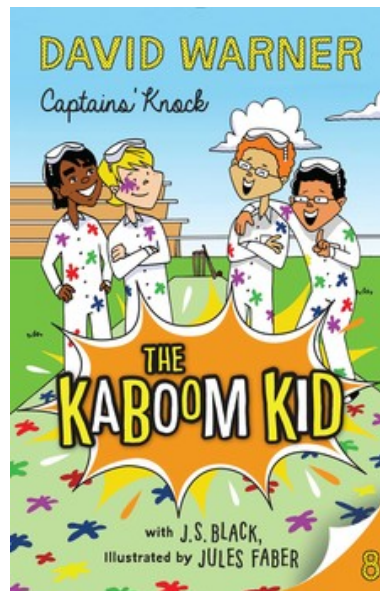
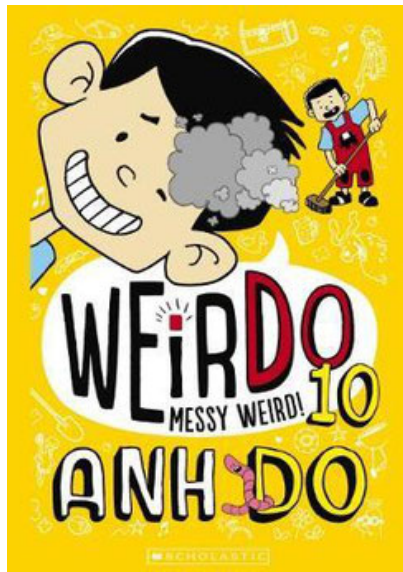

SYDNEY WRITERS' FESTIVAL:

The program has been announced for this year's Sydney Writers' Festival (SWF), which runs from 30 April to 6 May.



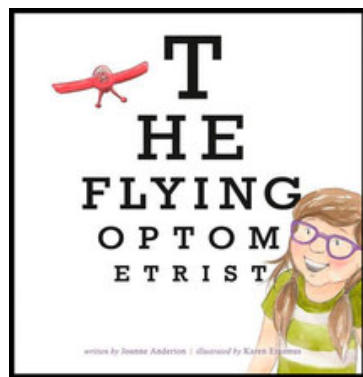
Sixty international guests and 400 Australian writers, academics and public figures will take part in events held across greater Sydney, with the festival moving its main hub from Walsh Bay to a temporary home at Carriageworks and the Seymour Centre while the Walsh Bay Arts Precinct is redeveloped.

A two-day family program will be held at Sydney Town Hall on 5 and 6 May, featuring Jeff Kinney, Junot Díaz, Jacqueline Harvey and Leigh Hobbs. The festival will also bring back its full-day program dedicated to young adult fiction, which will be held at Riverside Theatres in Parramatta on 5 May.

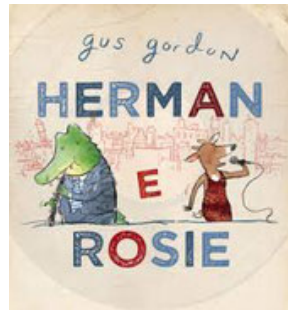

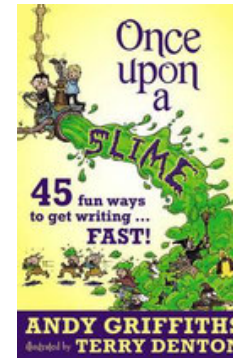
