
Gail Erskine is President of the **Children's Book Council of Australia NSW Branch** and has

Kids' writing legend Paul Jennings graces our podcast and host Nat becomes one very excited big-kid.


Paul Jennings has written over one hundred stories and has won every Australian children's choice book award.


In 1995 he was made a Member of the Order of Australia for services to children's literature and he was awarded the prestigious Dromkeen Medal in 2001.



On Our Radar


